

Dear Partners and friends of Haiti,

Reviewing our email responses from so many of you brought tears to our eyes as we were reassured repeatedly how you are praying for Haiti and giving toward the hurricane relief effort. What a blessing you all are! We feel so much stronger knowing that we are representing many people who love this little country.

We want to bring you up to date on the relief efforts. Through your help, the pastors have been able to begin to clean the mud out of their homes. As we have shared before, some have mud several feet deep in their homes and a few have it almost to the second floor. This is a monumental task, and we hope that the mud has not gotten too hard to remove easily!

Several of our pastors have been sick, caused no doubt from the deplorable water situation. We know that many others have been sick as well.

After the mud is removed, they will begin to repair and rebuild. When we were there a couple of weeks ago, there was only one church that could hold services. This is a step that we must take soon. This is in the northern part.

Some of our churches in the Port-au-Prince, Lower Artibonite and South areas have been able to begin to work on the roofs and walls that were demolished. Some of the schools are being repaired in these areas because school opened on the 6th of October. BUT in the north, they will not open for some time. So in the north, we are not to that stage yet.

In the meantime, food and other supplies are being delivered to all areas. On Tuesday, we are returning to Gonaives with cameras in hand to be able to show you more of what has happened and what is being done about it. So in the next week or so we hope to have more images to share with you. We also want you to meet some of the pastors and hear from them their story of terror and victory. Pray for us as we attempt this.

Also, please continue to pray for all of us here. Please continue to be obedient to the voice of God as He leads people to give financially to help the Haitian people. PLEASE remember to mark any contributions **HAITI HURRICANE RELIEF** and send to the Bishops' Famine and Relief Fund. This way the total amount will go TO HAITI during this crucial time. Otherwise, it will not come to Haiti to help our pastors and people.
